Transferring to a teaching Degree

The Bachelor of Educational Studies assists domestic and international students to work in education-related fields, other than teaching. The degree prepares graduates to pursue a career in corporate training, educational consultancy, online learning, vocational and community education, curriculum writing, youth services or adult learning.

Students, completing the first year, may be eligible to apply for transfer into their chosen Bachelor-level Teaching degree. Students, completing the three-year program can progress to a postgraduate, initial-teacher-education qualification.

The Bachelor-of Educational Studies is virtually identical to the following Bachelor of Education programs:

- Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood and Primary)
- Bachelor of Education (Primary)
- Bachelor of Education (Primary and Special Education)

Attention must be paid to the selection of the fourth unit in the second-semester of the first year.

You can apply to transfer to your Bachelor-level Teaching degree near the end of your second semester.

Transfers into a Bachelor-level teaching or other discipline degree can occur at any point; however, your enrolment choices will influence to amount of credit that can be transferred into your new degree.
