Overview

Students in this program study **TWO** electives. The usual semesters where suitable elective studies will be made available are Semester 2 of year 1, Summer, and Semester 1 of year 2.

As long as the elective is coded at 500-level or higher, then the elective choices in this program are *not restricted* (this is a significant change from the earlier program, as described on page 2). That is, units at either 500-level or 600-level may be studied, and they do not need to be from the School of Education.

Master of Teaching / Graduate Certificate of Religious Education

Students in this program are advised to study Theology, Biblical Studies or Religious Education units that would completement the GCRE set of THBS501, THCT500, EDRE527, EDRE528. Examples may include:

- THBS601 Literature of the Hebrew Bible
- THBS606 Interpreting Biblical Texts for Contemporary Times
- EDRE632 Educating for Inter-Religious Understanding
- EDRE639 School and Parish: Partners in Religious Education
- EDRE644 Teaching Church Tradition

Accreditation to Work in Catholic Schools (Victoria)

Students in the Master of Teaching seeking accreditation to work in Catholic schools may complete EDRE642. Students completing the GCRE should *not* complete EDRE642.

General Electives

EDLL605 - Culturally Responsive Teaching and Leadership and EDLL606 Leading Change in Education are offered in addition to the electives units listed on pp. 4-5.

Curriculum, Pedagogy and Assessment Units as Electives

There are some instances where completion of a CPA 1 unit (i.e., EDXX599) may be desirable as an elective. For instance, science graduates may well be called upon to teach mathematics regardless of whether they are formally qualified for mathematics as a teaching area. For this reason, study of EDMA599 may be a desirable option. Similarly, Humanities graduates may find benefit in studying EDEN599 (English); visual artists to study EDMS599 (Media Studies); English graduates to study EDTL599 (TESOL).

It is very important to note that this does not provide you an additional formal teaching area, because that is defined by your prior undergraduate study. It is a matter of providing 'elective opportunities' which may support out-of-field teaching that you may be called on to do when employed as a teacher.

This is all made possible because many CPA units are offered in semester 2 as well as semester 1: you would usually complete your 'main two' in your first semester, and then an elective one in a later semester.

It also follows that there would be an opportunity for students who are actually qualified for a <u>third teaching area</u> to study the CPAs for that, and thus graduate with three teaching areas. This can lead to a heavy study load in PT2 of year 2 because of when the CPA2 units are offered (there is no duplicate offering of these), and a re-arrangement of your course map to make this possible should be discussed with your course advisor.

<u>Vocational Studies</u>: the units EDVS599 and EDVS699 are available. This area usually studied as an 'add on' to either mathematics or English, to cover the particular pedagogy and curriculum of teaching mathematics or English in vocational education settings.

Completing either EDTL599 (TESOL) or Vocational Studies would be an advantage to students whose direction would be to work in schools offering <u>VCAL</u>, <u>disadvantaged schools</u> or in <u>ethnically diverse contexts</u>.

Very important note: this option of completing CPA units is not available to students who commenced prior to 2022.

Overview

Students in this program study ONE elective. The unit must be coded at 600-level or higher and must be from the School of Education (an "EDXX6YY" unit). This is a significant difference with the program that had its first intake in 2022.

In this program, Master of Teaching / Graduate Certificate of Religious Education students do NOT study any elective.

EDRE642 is available to Victorian Master of Teaching students who seek accreditation to work in the Catholic sector; it is unnecessary for students completing the GCRE.
