Applied Project Management

UNMC126

This unit focuses on practical techniques for selecting, planning and executing projects in medium to large-scale organisations. It will equip you with skills to use collaborative software and project management tools.

- **Duration:** 75 hours (online and on-campus residential delivery)
- **Delivery mode:** Multi-mode (online and residential). Residential mode delivered by industry professionals with opportunities for industry collaboration.
- **Campus:** Brisbane and Townsville campuses in Terms 1, 3, 6 or 8 2025
- **Credit points:** 5

Diploma of Business pathway

- **Completed microcredentials:** UNMC125 and UNMC126
- **Credit awarded:** equivalent to 1 diploma unit (10 credit points)
- **Diploma requirement:** seven additional units
